1. TASKSHEET 1 Statue of Liberty

- What is the name of this statute? Statue of Liberty
- Where do you find it? In New York.
- How old is she? Erected October, 28, 1886.
- How tall is she? 93 metres.

2. TASKSHEET 2 Native Indians

- Name famous Indian tribes. Cherokee, Sioux, Apache, Navajo, Iroquois
- When did Indians go to America? 15,000 years ago.
- Where did they migrate from? They migrated from Asia (through the Bering Bay).
- Can you name some Indian symbols? Eagle, bear, sun, tepee, totem pole.

3. TASKSHEET 3 Tower Bridge

- Where can you see this bridge? In London, UK.
- Why is it blue? In 1977, it was painted blue to celebrate the Queen's silver jubilee.
- How long does it take to lift (open) the bridge? It takes 1 minute 15 seconds to open.

4. TASKSHEET 4 McDonald's fast food

- When was the first McDonalds' restaurant opened? In 1948.
- Where? Bernardino, California, USA.
- Who founded it? Two brothers: Richard and Maurice McDonald.
- Who is the public face of McDonalds'? Ronald McDonald

5. TASKSHEET 5 Coca Cola

- What was Coca Cola first sold for? First sold as tonic, medicine. Confederate Colonel John Pemberton, who was wounded in the American Civil War and became addicted to morphine, began a quest to find a substitute for the problematic drug.

- How many different variants of Coca Cola can you list? So far 9: Diet Coke, Diet Coke Caffeine-Free, Caffeine-Free Coca-Cola, Coca-Cola Zero Sugar, Coca-Cola Cherry, Coca-Cola Vanilla, Coca-Cola Citra, Coca-Cola Life, Coca-Cola Mango
- What does the name Coca Cola refer to? Coca leaves, and kola nuts (a source of caffeine).
- Why did they start to put it into cans not only in bottles? Cans were invented for soldiers.

6. TASKSHEET 6 Stonehenge

Who built Stonehenge? One of the most popular beliefs is that it was built by the druids, the highest priest of the Celts.

- What was Stonehenge used for? Most probably it was used as a temple.
- How tall is Stonehenge? 9 metres.
- How old is Stonehenge? 5,000 years old (built around 3000 BC).

7. TASKSHEET 7 The royal couple

- How old is Queen Elisabeth II? Born in 1926, she is now 94 years old.
- How long has she been a queen? She was crowned in 1952.
- How many children does she have? She has 4 children.
- Who will follow her on the throne? Prince Charles will follow her, then Prince William.

8. TASKSHEET 8 The Queen's guard

- What is their duty? To protect the Queen and the royal residences.
- What do they wear? Full dress uniform: red tunics, black trousers.
- Are they punished if they smile when they are on duty? Yes, can be fined up to £200.
- What is their hat made of? Bearskin.

9. TASKSHEET 9 Map of the UK

• How many countries are in the United Kingdom? 4 countries (England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland).

What are the capital cities of these countries? England – London; Wales – Cardiff; Scotland – Edinburgh; Northern Ireland – Belfast.

- What is the nationality of the people who live in the British Isles? British (English, Wales, Scottish, Irish).
- Which is the most mountainous part of the UK? The northern part: the Pennines form the backbone of the island, and the highlands of Scotland are also mountainous areas.

10. TASKSHEET 10 Map of the USA

- How many states are there in the USA? There are 50 states.
- Which city is the Federal capital of the US? Washington, D.C.
- Which is the most mountainous part of the US? The western part is the most mountainous.
- Where can you find big lakes in the US? On the northeast border of USA and the Canada. The famous Niagara Falls can also be found here.
